# Introducing Te Pūkenga – New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology

Te Pūkenga brings together 16 Institutes of Technology and Polytechnics (ITPs) with 9 of the 11 Industry Training Organisations (ITOs) across New Zealand.

Te Pūkenga was established to:

- Effectively address New Zealand's skills shortages across all industries
- Unify the applied and vocational tertiary education system to meet the needs of learners, employers and regions
- Enhance collaboration and remove any competition between Te Pūkenga campuses
- Allow learners to seamlessly study on-campus, in-work and online

Establishment of Te Pūkenga creates a strong, unified, sustainable, higher vocational and applied tertiary education system that is fit for the future of work and delivers the skills that learners, employers and communities need to thrive.

- 1. Move to a **more balanced and sustainable portfolio** of inbound, outbound, offshore and online international education.
- 2. Enable us to **invest strategically**, and to communicate effectively and deliberately the quality of our applied education delivery on the global stage.
- A preference for value over volume, where the quality of our relationships and partnerships are the driving forces.
- A focus on exporting our experience and expertise in the design, development and delivery of education and training outcomes.
- 5. Partnering with our indigenous Maori people to provide a **unique bicultural experience**.



## What to expect from us? (2)

- 6. A committed focus on **providing equity of access** to indigenous and disabled learners.
- 7. A high degree of **flexibility and seamlessness** between on-campus, in-work or online learning.
- 8. A commitment to **matching our regional mix of provisioning & delivery** with meeting the high-value and long-term skills shortage needs of our 16 regions.
- 9. For our agents it means an opportunity to **expand their collaboration throughout our network**, allowing new opportunity for a wider range of their students to study in New Zealand.
- 10. Creating **greater physical offshore presence in key regions**, such as NZ Learning Centres.

#### What name will be used internationally, NZIST or Te Pūkenga?

 The full name used internationally is Te Pūkenga – New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology (NZIST), while in some countries NZIST will be translated into the local language, for example this is the case in Japan and China

#### Will Te Pūkenga continue to offer postgraduate level programmes?

Yes, Te Pūkenga will continue to offer programmes up to Level 10 (Doctoral)

#### Will there be any disruption to my students' studies?

#### Will Te Pūkenga consist of New Zealand Government owned institutions only?

#### Will offers of place from Te Pūkenga be sent from a centralised office to students?

 No, in the foreseeable future application and enrolment functions will continue to be carried out by each regional subsidiary

#### What will the Student Visa state as being the study provider and study location?

 Student visas will state that the study provider is Te Pūkenga and the study location will be the city where the campus is located

# Will students be able to apply to a particular campus or will they be told where they must study?

Students can apply to any campus of their choosing across Te Pūkenga network

#### Will international entry requirements for similar programmes be standardised?

Not for the Semester 1, 2023 intake

#### Will programmes be unified?

This is happening from 2023 and will involve many projects over a few years

#### What is the tuition fee structure for 2023 enrolments?

Programme fees are set separately by the each of the regional ITP subsidiaries.
 From Semester 2, 2023 there will be standardized fees set across the Te Pūkenga network.

## Will there be scholarships offered by Te Pūkenga for international students enrolling in 2023?
